Occur and How We Can Prevent It" From Individual Tragedies to National Epidemics," attracted a large audience who engaged with Dr. Gilligan in a lively

discussion and stayed on for a signing of his new book <u>Why Some Politicians</u> Are More Dangerous Than Others.

In his talk, Dr. Gilligan drew on his 40+ years of research and work in the field of violence prevention as well as his own treatment of violent individuals to offer insights valuable to our community, our state, and our country. Dr. Gilligan also spoke about his experience serving as the expert witness during the U.S. Supreme Court case Brown v. Plata, in which the Court ruled to order the state of California to reduce its overcrowded prisons by more than 30,000.

Following his talk, Glendon sponsored a small luncheon with Dr. Gilligan, in which he met and answered questions from a group of educators and community leaders, many from the fields of law enforcement and criminal justice and many who work directly with at-risk and gang youth in Santa Barbara.

Dr. Gilligan went on to to receive the Lifetime Achievement Award from the International Violence and Trauma Conference, where he then participated in the screening of the Glendon film "Voices of Violence Part II: Effective Treatment of Violent Individuals," in which he is a featured expert.

National Depression Awareness Month






Dr. Firestone then delivered the Section VII Presidential Address entitled "Objective Assessment Measures of Suicide and Violence Risk."



Glendon Violence Documentary is a Winner at Columbus International Film Festival





The documentary film produced by the Glendon Association "Voices of Violence Part I: The Roots of Violence" won Honorable Mention at the 59th Columbus International Film + Video Festival's "Chris Awards."

Voices of Violence Part I: The

Roots of Violence

The film integrates stories from violent individuals with commentary from experts in the field of violence, leading to a better understanding of both the developmental issues and thought processes of those engaging in violent behavior. The film's narratives are informed by the formerly violent individuals' own understanding of

the dynamics of their violent behavior, which they've arrived at through the process of therapy. The film reveals the triggers that led these men to commit violence and the destructive thoughts or "voices" that were directing their behavior. The film features interviews with leading experts, including Daniel Siegel, Felicity de Zulueta, David Jones, Peter Fonagy, Donald Meichenbaum, James Gilligan, Father Boyle of Homeboy Industries, and Aqeela Sherrills of The Reverence Project.

Voices of Violence Part II: Effective Treatment of Violent Individuals

In part two of the series 10 experts examine the critical components of effective treatment programs for violent individuals by focusing on prison programs in California and the U.K. Beyond the creation of an environment of safety and respect, these therapists confront the patriarchal beliefs, social misperceptions, and destructive thoughts that precipitate violent responses to real or perceived threats. Vignettes of actual therapy sessions, along with interviews with incarcerated men, display the remarkable insight these individuals can achieve through treatment. Their chilling accounts of violence will challenge the empathy of even seasoned therapists, yet many of their stories are ultimately redemptive, as they learn to make use of their violent pasts by working to prevent violence in their communities. This video demonstrates vividly that conventional assumptions about crime and punishment fail to endure close scrutiny.
